BOBBY TITTLE NAMED DISTRICT 6 HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL OF THE YEAR

Montgomery, Ala: Bobby Tittle, principal of Ohatchee High has been named District 6 High School Principal of the Year.

Tittle has been in education for 19 years. He served 7 years as a band director, 3 years as assistant principal at Talladega High School, and 2 years as principal.
